

Arcata High students advance in statewide 'Student Voices Campaign' video competition

ARCATA, CA. – Arcata High school students in a statewide creative contest are moving forward.

Two teams from Arcata High were selected as finalists in what is called the "Student Voices Campaign".

Out of 50 videos entered from across California – these local students have made it into the top 14 final groups selected by judges.
