### DID YOU KNOW?

The Student Voices Campaign offers a hands-on opportunity for students grade 7-12 to learn about and impact school policymaking. In California, the Local Control Funding Formula, or LCFF, requires that districts consult with students, parents, teachers, and community members each spring to create an official plan for the coming years. The Student Voices Campaign brings students' vision for better schools directly to the decision-makers in their district.

Developed by the California Alliance for Arts Education, Student Voices Campaign resources help students understand their role in planning and budgeting for their school district and facilitate the video production process:

- Classroom Guide structures the campaign as a project-based learning opportunity, with elements of civic participation, creative expression, media production, and community engagement
- LCFF Primer provides an introduction to how schools receive funding in California, who makes the decisions, what issues are prioritized for funding, and how students can be involved in the process
- Video Production Handbook guides students through the entire process of making a short video, including group member roles, storyboarding, filming techniques and post-production considerations
